

DRESS CODE POLICY

Standard of dress and general appearance will determine the privilege of Members and their guests to use thecourse and facilities of NSW Golf Club, and shall be consistent with the dignity, standing and character of the Club. It is the Member's responsibility to comply with these regulations for themselves and their visitors.

The standard of dress shall be as prescribed in the Dress Code Policy, which will be displayed in the Clubhouse and illustrated on the Club's website.

Enforcement of the dress code is the responsibility of staff. Their determination is final and should be respectfully accepted without debate or further reference to other staff or Club Directors who may be present at the time. This courtesy applies regardless of the attire in question having been previously worn at the Club.

While not encouraged, golfers arriving at the Club for golf in non-conforming attire must proceed directly to the locker room to change.

Members arriving at the Club in non-conforming attire to collect their golf clubs should contact the Golf Shop and request that their golf clubs are left on the bag stand in the car park.

MEN'S ATTIRE

Golf Course and Practice Facilities:

- · All attire must be golf specific or of similar style
- Golf shirts must be collared or roll collared, and must be tucked in
- · Trousers and shorts must be tailored and be worn with a belt
- Socks and sockettes (below ankle socks) must be white, however, black anklet socks and sockettes may be worn with black shoes
- · Shoes must be soft spiked and golf specific

Clubhouse:

- Clean, dry, golf attire and smart casual wear are suitable after golf
- Shirts that are designed and tailored to be worn out may be worn in the Clubhouse, subject to their suitability as
 determined by staff
- Shoes that are specifically designed to be worn without socks, e.g., leather moccasin style and boat shoes, may be worn without socks
- · Attire deemed appropriate by staff for the occasion or circumstance, e.g., fancy dress occasions

Not acceptable:

- Attire that is deemed inappropriate by staff.
- · Attire displaying overt advertising logos other than golfing brands or the manufacturers label.
- · Hats, visors or golf caps must not be worn in the Clubhouse
- · Golf caps and visors must not be worn backwards at any time
- Cargo, denim, tracksuits or draw-string pants.
- Open sandal-type footwear and sandshoes/trainers
- · T-shirts, hoodies and singlets

WOMEN'S ATTIRE

Golf Course and Practice Facilities:

- · Neat and well-maintained golf specific apparel
- Tops and shirts designed to be worn outside bottom garments must be golf appropriate
- All tops and shirts must be golf appropriate attire
- Shoes must be soft spiked and golf specific

Clubhouse:

- · Neat golfing attire is acceptable
- Attire deemed appropriate by staff for the occasion or circumstance, e.g., fancy dress occasions

Not acceptable:

- Attire that is deemed inappropriate by staff.
- · Attire displaying overt advertising logos other than golfing brands or the manufacturers label
- Hats, visors or golf caps must not be worn in the Clubhouse
- Golf caps and visors must not be worn backwards at any time
- · Cargo, denim, tracksuits or draw-string pants.
- Sandshoes/trainers
- T-shirts, hoodies and singlets
